
### Program overview

In Advanced Training in Palliative Medicine, you'll explore in-depth specialty training in the management of patients with active, progressive and far-advanced disease, a limited prognosis and the focus of care is their quality of life. You will train under supervision and prepare for independent practice as a consultant. The program builds your skills through <u>work-</u> <u>based learning and assessment</u> <u>tools</u>.

### Program updates

The Advanced Training in Palliative Medicine Program is evaluated biennially by the Training Committee in Palliative Medicine (TCPM) to ensure that



it's in line with educational best practice. Changes in program requirements may occur and could impact your training plan. The College will provide sufficient notice prior to implementing any change. You must always ensure you're following the correct requirements during your training.

### Entry requirements

### **RACP Basic Trainees**

#### **Adult Medicine and Paediatrics & Child Health streams**

Basic Trainees applying must have:

- completed RACP Basic Training, including Written and Clinical Examinations
- a current medical registration
- been appointed to an appropriate Advanced Training position

#### Already a Fellow

#### Adult Medicine stream only

You can apply to enter Advanced Training in Palliative Medicine if you:

- hold a Fellowship from an eligible medical college
- have a current medical registration
- have been appointed to an appropriate Advanced Training position

Fellows from all RACP's Divisions (AMD and PCHD), Faculties (AFOEM, AFPHM and AFRM) and Chapters (AChAM, AChPM, AChSHM and CCCH) are eligible to apply. Other medical colleges eligible are:

New and current trainees need to <u>apply for Advanced Training</u> each year.

### Duration

Advanced Training in Palliative Medicine requires 3 years (36 months) of full-time equivalent (FTE) training.

### Fellowship

Once you've completed all requirements of your training and the TCPM has recommended you for admission, the College will invite you to apply for Fellowship of the RACP (RACP Basic Trainees pathway) or Fellowship of the Australasian Chapter of Palliative Medicine (post-Fellowship pathway).

New Fellows receive formal notification from the College of their successful admission to Fellowship and a letter confirming the completion of their training.
