



Transition to College-Led Training Advisory Committee

Communique - 8 December 2020

The second meeting of the Australian Government Department of Health Transition to College-Led Training Advisory Committee (TCLTAC) was held on 8 December 2020.

The committee has been established to provide advice to the Australian Government on the development and implementation of reforms to the delivery of general practice training as part of the transition to a college-led training model.

At this meeting, members discussed matters relating to the plans for marketing to applicants for the Australian General Practice Training program for 2022. Members also discussed the timelines and transition processes for the grant arrangements with Regional Training Organisations.

Members were encouraged to consult within their organisations between meetings to ensure that steady progress is being made on matters discussed.

As part of the transition considerations, members agreed that the Department of Health, in consultation with the two colleges, will analyse the rural and general pathways of the Australian General Practice Training program for 2022 and present a paper to the next meeting seeking advice of members. The Australian Medical Association representative also offered to share some analysis of the two pathways.

Members reiterated the importance of stability for registrars during this period of transition to college-led training. The wellbeing of registrars will be at the forefront of the committee's considerations.

The Committee will next meet on 15 December 2020.
